Dear Family,

As we reflect on 2025 and God's faithfulness to the Center for Biblical Unity, we are humbled by how far the Lord has carried this ministry and how He continues to expand our reach and influence for His glory. CFBU exists to have biblically faithful, Christ-centered conversations on race, justice, and unity. We aim to proclaim a biblically faithful vision of unity rooted squarely in the Gospel: one race, one people, one Savior. In a world more divided than ever, the Lord is using our voice to help Christians think clearly, speak truthfully, and stand confidently on Scripture amid society's most pressing cultural questions.

This year has seen meaningful growth across our platforms and programs. Through podcasts, training courses, speaking events, book clubs, and our first in-person conference, we've equipped believers to engage with race, justice, and cultural issues, including contemporary critical social theories, in ways that reflect the heart of Christ—not the confusing ideologies of the day. Your partnership has made these resources possible, and your prayers have sustained us as we labor together for unity founded on Christ first.

2025 was a significant year for The Center for Biblical Unity. Three notable highlights: our inaugural Center for Biblical Unity national conference, held in Birmingham, AL, and the official launch of two new spaces on our website, The Issues and the Worldview Wire, that examines issues of culture from a historic Christian worldview.

Over the summer, Krista worked to assemble 20 new essays for the website that provide short essays on popular hot button issues, such as racial reconciliation, antiracism and slavery. We launched this new space in September and will continue to build it out this throughout 2026.

Last fall, the CFBU team partnered with Briarwood Presbyterian Church and Seminary, and Urban Hope Community Church for our first in-person national conference. We were excited to see attendees, representing nine different states, come out to be equipped on topics such as Biblical Justice and Radical Socialism's Attack on the Nuclear Family.

This November, we launched the Worldview Wire, a new space on our website dedicated to examining current cultural topics and events through a biblical lens and unpacking the worldview commitments that lie beneath the surface of every cultural issue. Worldview Wire navigates the complexities of culture through the lens of Scripture.

The impact of CFBU is not measured merely in numbers, but in the Christ-centered conversations, transformed thinking, and emboldened faith we witness as we travel around the country. CFBU is empowering Christians to stand firm. We continue to hear from parents, pastors, leaders, and everyday believers who are more confident in race, justice, the critical social theories, and biblical unity because of the materials this ministry has provided. Your support, whether through prayer, volunteering, generous giving, or sharing our resources, multiplies our collective impact for the Kingdom.

As we look toward the months ahead, we pray for even greater fruit: deeper discipleship, clearer understanding, and more Christians equipped to stand on the solid foundation of Scripture in a culture that desperately needs the unifying message of the Gospel.

Thank you for standing with us. We are honored to walk forward together in the hope of Christ and biblical unity.

UNITY The foundation for racial unity comes through God's initiative in redemptive history. God has made a provision so that all humans can enter into unity with the Triune God and with their fellow image-bearers through the blood of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

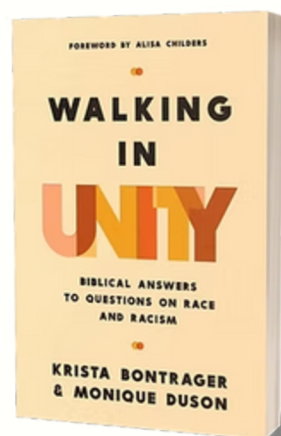

Impact at a glance

The Center for Biblical Unity (CFBU) continues to solidify its role as the leading Christian voice on race, justice, and unity by boldly addressing the influence of Critical Social Theories on the church and society.

this movement, engaging diverse audiences around the globe in transformative conversations about Biblical unity. Whether through *powerful* books, thought-provoking white papers, *engaging* podcasts, dynamic videos, *online and in-person training*, *keynote addresses at major conferences*, or providing expert *consultation to leaders in churches, schools, businesses, and communities*, their influence is growing—sparking conversations that challenge, inspire, and unite.

The release of their book in October 2024, *Walking in Unity*, marked a new chapter in CFBU's mission. In 2025, our story reached new audiences and helped to expand CFBU's impact. In January, Monique flew to London, England, to join 4000 concerned leaders from around the world at the Alliance for Responsible Citizenship (ARC) conference. ARC was founded by Jordan Peterson, and Monique was able to be a part of it through our friend, Katy Faust. Monique and Krista were both speakers on the MAVEN conference tour. Krista was a plenary speaker at the Women in Apologetics national conference, with our friends Nancy Pearcey and Alycia Wood.

Impact

Story

Jamie's story unfolds after more than two decades in public education. For 21 years, she faithfully served as an elementary school teacher in the Indianapolis area, believing her classroom was a place to nurture children with truth, care, and integrity. But as her school district began rolling out trainings centered on DEI and social-emotional learning, Jamie found herself confronted with ideas that directly conflicted with her Biblical values.

The turning point came when a student identified as non-binary. Jamie was instructed to use a new name and plural pronouns for the child and was warned that failure to comply could result in disciplinary action—even if speaking in private conversations with colleagues. Soon after, she was also ordered to stop addressing her class as “boys and girls,” and instead use gender-neutral language like “friends” or “kids,” not just in her classroom, but as a recommended practice across the entire school.



As Jamie asked questions, especially about whether parents were aware or involved in these changes, she was met with silence. At the same time, books addressing gender fluidity, same-sex marriage, and racial ideology began appearing in school hallways without library oversight, reinforcing the very frameworks promoted in district trainings. When Jamie raised concerns with

administrators, including individuals from her own church community, she was counseled that compliance might help advance the gospel.

This season forced Jamie into a defining moment. For the first time in her career, she was labeled a “problematic employee.” She realized she had to choose between fearing man or fearing God. Though the cost was high and the isolation was intense, Jamie refused to bow to intimidation. She spoke up, shared information with parents, and accepted the consequences of standing firm.

It was during this painful and lonely time that Jamie discovered the Center for Biblical Unity. Through CFBU's resources, she found the biblical clarity she had been searching for. She learned how to define terms biblically, discern ideas carefully, and measure cultural claims against the authority of Scripture. CFBU helped her understand the foundational truths that we are one human race, that our identity is rooted in Genesis, and that true unity is found in Christ.

What began as a moment of crisis became a season of growth and strengthening. Jamie found conviction, courage, and clarity, and a reminder that Christians must not remain silent. Today, she stands equipped, encouraged, and deeply grateful for the Center for Biblical Unity's stand to ministry to speak boldly and faithfully to a culture that desperately needs truth.

LOOKING AHEAD

Below you will see a few of the strategic goals that The Center for Biblical Unity will be pursuing in 2026 and beyond.

- We are in the final stages of developing a standardized **Statement on Race** for use by various entities to articulate a Biblical view of race, ethnicity, and racism.
- Host a second **annual conference** on the Biblical model of unity and the impact of secular critical theories on different areas of life.
- Launch a **nine-month adult mentoring program** focused on equipping Christians to be ambassadors for justice in their local context.
- Expand our capacity to **offer low-cost consultations** to global leaders dealing with critical theory challenges.
- **Increase our profile** to ensure the message of Biblical unity reaches new audiences by building new partnerships in 2026.
