A BIBLICAL ALTERNATIVE TO CRITICAL RACE THEORY

The Center for Biblical Unity seeks to unite Christians around the topic of racial justice by looking to the Bible for answers.

Los Angeles, California – As racial tensions continue to rise in our country, many Christians are struggling to wade through the cultural narratives. Popular ideologies such as Critical Race Theory have invaded the culture as well as the church, and believers find themselves trapped between opposing worldviews.

The Center for Biblical Unity is a relatively new ministry that gained traction in the summer of 2020 in the wake of the George Floyd race riots. The founder, Monique Duson, is a former proponent of Critical Race Theory. As a trained social worker, Monique has spent much of her life working with children and underprivileged groups. She worked in South Africa for four years with children and teachers whose lives had been impacted by drugs and violence.

After advocating for Critical Race Theory for 20 years, Monique began to see inconsistencies between CRT and historical Christianity. Through much study and research, she concluded that the Bible presents a more effective path to racial unity than the culture does. Duson states, "There is something greater than being woke. And that is the truth of the gospel of Jesus Christ."

The Center for Biblical Unity strives to facilitate respectful, profitable, and biblical conversations about race, unity, and justice. For true unity, the foundation of those conversations must be the Bible rather than culture. The Center for Biblical Unity hopes to equip Christians to approach these topics from a biblical worldview, and it offers tools and resources to support these efforts. Currently, the Center for Biblical Unity has an active Facebook page, a blog, and virtual book clubs, and it has recently developed a small-group curriculum that will be released soon.

The Center for Biblical Unity has received endorsements from prominent Christian leaders such as J.P. Moreland, Brett Kunkle, Alisa Childers and Jonathan Morrow.
